Kirkby Stephen Town Council Report 2019 - Joan Johnstone

The Town Council continues to meet monthly. In January David Gilmour resigned due to health problems, which reduced the Council to eight members.

Looking back over the year a great deal of council business has focused on Appleby Fair issues. In 2018 the local community had many concerns regarding the numbers visiting the town in the run up to the fair. People arrived early and this led to increased pressure not only on the locals, but also the police. The annual horse sale was cancelled which led to the animals being sold on the main street causing a chaotic scene, with travellers spilling out of public houses and drinking in restricted areas, anti-social behaviour and littering were an added problem.

A public meeting followed the fair, a hundred plus people attended to inform MASCG of their many concerns.

The Council has tried and failed on a number of occasions, through correspondence to the Chairman of MASCG to have input into the new strategy going forward, this has proved disappointing and frustrating. On the positive side we pushed for a local representative of the settled community to join the group and I am pleased to report that County Councillor, Phil Dew, has been appointed.

Chief Superintendent, Rob O'Connor, who is the appointed Gold Commander for this

A dedicated 101 line is being set up as is CCTV to monitor the town. The town's licensees have met with Police and Eden District Councils Licensing Officer and are being asked to cooperate with the enforcement of no drinking in restricted areas and using plastic glasses.

The parking arrangements for caravans along the A685 remains a concern to locals. The Gypsy community are willing to play their part in seeing the fair run smoothly. It was noted that from a meeting, with Sedbergh and Kirkby Lonsdale Councils, that they had had many similar problems.

The Eden Local Plan has now been adopted and at a training session led by officers the Council was told that the plan now supersedes the Neighbourhood Plan. Planning applications are consulted on when required. Paula Smith, Conservation Officer for EDC, spoke to the Council about producing an appraisal and management plan for the conservation area and a working group has now been formed.

The Flood Prevention Group was disbanded as it was felt that this came within the remit of the Community Local Plan, the Council agreed to provide sand bags and sand when needed.

The Council formally applied to join the Upper Eden Community Interest Company and Eileen Simpson was approved by the CIC to become a director.

Councillors have held two meetings with officers from EDC regarding devolution of services, these have resulted in the Council taking responsibility for footway lighting and we are still looking into the terms for the transfer of the public toilets, Stoneshott car park and the two play areas. Along with the CIC we are exploring the transfer of the Visitor Centre building.

The Town Council agreed to be the nominated body for the Kirkby Stephen Community Sports Association bid for funding from EDC Signature Fund. We were delighted that £75,000 has been offered, subject to some additional funding from the Grammar School. These grants along with others will see a new all-weather pitch installed this summer. Congratulations must go to association members, Andrea Dixon and Claire Smithson, who have worked diligently to secure the funding. Recognition must also go to Alex Birtles for overseeing all the legal requirements, thanks also to officers at Eden who have been a great support.

Highway matters are efficiently dealt with by County Councillor Phil Dew. Reports of inconsiderate parking on pavements and around the Market Square are ongoing.

A review of the Council's Asset Register has been undertaken by the Clerk and an update report and valuation has now been adopted.

The Council led by the Clerk held a pre-

budget meeting to assess the present financial situation. It was resolved to build up restricted reserves over a five-year period in light of an anticipated increase in expenditure in the future. Going forward finance reports will feature higher up the agenda with a monthly bank reconciliation report followed by a quarterly budget monitoring statement.

The Council continues to support the Burial Board, Visitor Centre and Easter Rally, through grant giving. This year the Brittleton Bursary awarded four young people funds and we wish them success improving their chosen skills.

The Community and Council Centre continues to support the local community and with the change in the delivery of library services the staff are involved in helping customers to use the self-service system, the assistance needed is being monitored. The licence between Cumbria County Council and the Town Council to occupy the building is drafted and almost ready to sign.

Eden District Council arranged a bench marking exercise for the town, the result was good with cleanliness scoring highly. It was also noted that the town had no empty shops and that shop fronts had been improved.

To celebrate no empty shops an initiative by Linnhe Harrison, of Mini Eden, and Olivia, of Only Willow, colourful banners have been designed and erected by businesses to make the town look vibrant. This has been well received and a big 'thank you' to those involved is called for.

The Christmas lights were again erected by a willing team of volunteers and the switch on proved an enjoyable event. I thank the volunteers and the Vicar and PCC for the use of the Parish Church. Congratulations also to the shops that took part in the excellent window competition.

I thank our Council employees, Christian Barnes, Wendy Hamilton, Zelda Bromfield and Alan Simpson, for their commitment to the work of this Council.

As we come to the end of the four-year cycle of the Town Council it is fitting to acknowledge Councillors Glenys Lumley and Judy Sowerby who are standing down, they have worked tirelessly for this Council. Likewise, EDC Councillors Trevor Ladhams and Valerie Kendall who are not seeking re-election. In Trevor's case his longstanding involvement with first the Town Council and then EDC is to be applauded and I do thank them for their contribution to the public life of the team.

Thank you to County Councillor Phil Dew who is enthusiastic and hardworking on behalf of the community of Upper Eden. My thanks to my fellow councillors for all their support and commitment to me and the community. As we look forward to new members joining the Town Council I hope with renewed energy and commitment we can work together for the benefit of all the community.

Kirkby Stephen Town Council News

New Councillors for Kirkby Stephen

The election on the 2 May was uncontested and standing councillors, Joan Johnstone, Dorothy Thornton, Alex Birtles, Mike Walker and Paul Richardson were re- elected unopposed. New councillors: Conrad Lynch, Sandy Lancaster and Grace Wren have joined them for the 2019 to 2023 term. At the council's first meeting on the 7th May Joan Johnstone was elected to serve another term as Chairman and Paul Richardson re-elected to the Vice Chairmanship. At the last council's meeting in April correspondence was read out from a local resident regarding the increase in the council's precept and it was agreed that the basis of the reply should be published in our newsletter. Of course, it is recognised that electors may be taken back by a headline figure showing a 36% increase. This is something that our councillors have thought very carefully about and have implemented with regret. It is however worth pointing out that the increase actually amounts to just under £35 over the year or 67 pence a week on a band D property. The council does consider what it costs resident tax payers when it sets a precept. The underlying factors behind this increase are Devolution of Services and the need to build up the council's recently depleted reserves.

In the years 2017 to 2018 and 2018 to 2019 the council set a deficit budget reducing its reserves by approximately £28k to fund a 'lone working policy' that it had to implement to protect vulnerable staff because it was anticipated that the Library Service would withdraw staff from its Library which the council part occupies at Local Links. Local Links provides a range of community support services including the library which the council is keen to support and continue. There are three councils in Cumbria, County, District and Local (meaning Towns and Parishes). In the last year the District and County took measures to pass some of the services they deliver to Kirkby Stephen residents to the Local Council (us). This is what is meant by 'Devolution of Services'. Their bills appear to be stable but in reality, we are now providing some of the services that they used to provide, last year footway lighting was transferred to the town council and this year we are negotiating over playgrounds, public toilets and carparks (which the council wants to keep free to use).

Our staff now provide some library services for the County Council in return for a reduced rent. In an ideal world you would have seen the element of the Council Tax precepted by the higher tier authorities reduced to reflect the fact they are providing less. However, they have not chosen to pass on these savings in their part of the council tax levy and in any case the figures are hardly visible in percentage terms. The devolution of all public toilets in Eden for example accounts for a saving of only 1% of Eden's budget. If we take on the toilets at Stoneshott (and it costs us the same as Eden to maintain them) then this will account for nearly 20% of our budget! By comparison with Cumbria County Council or Eden District Council our budgets are much smaller which makes the reporting of percentages seem much bigger.

The Council thinks that keeping these services free and available supports town centre vitality and we are proud that Kirkby Stephen, unlike other Eden towns, has no empty shops. The availability of free parking and public facilities is believed to be a factor that supports the towns retailers in difficult trading conditions. At the same time the council needs to improve its own financial standing and reverse the depletion of its reserves.

It was for these reasons that the council chose to increase its precept. However, the council is accountable to electors for its decisions and its expenditure and does its planning in an open and transparent manner. Residents will find all the council's minutes and decisions at <u>www.kirkby-stephen.com</u> and in the coming year these will be accompanied by significantly improved financial statements. Electors are welcome to participate in all our meetings and to feedback to councillors. Public participation always takes place at the beginning of every council meeting and it does inform councillors thinking. The council has been good at representing residents' interests and responding to residents' views.

I can't stress enough how welcome all electors are to attend meetings and participate. The council values and depends on public feedback to confirm and validate the spending decisions it takes.

A message from Phil Dew

Summer is fast approaching and with it the Appleby Horse Fair. The memories of last year's Fair are still fresh in the mind and for many people they conjure up a sense of fear and foreboding. You will be pleased, and hopefully reassured, to hear that I have not sat idly by over the past twelve months but have worked hard to bring about improvements – even though that process has at times been somewhat frustrating.

I now have a seat on the Multi Agency Strategic Coordinating Group [MASCG] which oversees the management of the Fair and I have been very vocal in meetings expressing the views and interests of local residents and businesses. I have visited Carlton Hall several times to discuss the policing of Phase 1 of the Fair with Peter McCall and Chief Superintendent Rob O'Connor [Gold Command]. I expect to see a much more robust and effective police presence in Kirkby Stephen this year with officers committed to maintaining law and order. I would encourage local residents to play their part by patiently reporting incidents on the dedicated 101 line which will be in operation for the duration of the Fair. Cumbria County Council Highways Officers have amended the Traffic Management Plan to restrict encampments on the A685 and I have accepted the compromises that have been made. In an ideal world there would be no stopping on the verge but that policy can't be implemented this year due to a lack of resources. Certain areas will be strictly out of bounds and I have asked officers to keep the carriageway clear of obstructions at all times.

I have done my best to improve relations with the genuine gypsy/traveller community in the hope that we will be able to work together to restore the traditional values of the Fair. Last month I visited Billy Welch at his home in Darlington and hosted a Gypsy/Traveller Cultural Evening in the Kings Arms, featuring Billy Welch and Bill Lloyd, which was attended by over one hundred people along with senior officers from Cumbria Constabulary. The evening passed peacefully and provided an opportunity to learn more about the history and customs of the gypsy/traveller people.

Very soon the talking will be over, the Fair will begin and our plans and preparations will be put to the test. Ultimately, we will be judged by results. Do not expect perfection. Compromises will inevitably have to be made. However we will not tolerate the unacceptable behaviour that became the norm last year. The police cannot work miracles but we do expect them to keep us safe. That is the bottom line.

I will be available throughout the Fair for advice and support. If you have any concerns let me know and I will do my best to resolve them with the help of senior officers. All my contact details are available online or at the Local Links.

Village Verges

This season has developed into a weekly litter pick, 10am til 12pm every Tuesday, since October 2018 - 30 weeks. With the weekly average of x7 blue Eden District refuse bags we have collected and recycled approximately 200 bags from the local roadsides verges. A small team of Hartley and Kirkby residents have regularly joined in with this project and we have had full support from the Kirkby Stephen Local Links, who have loaned us pickers, rings and blue bags, for which we are very grateful. A big thank you to Ann Sandell, of "Walkers are Welcome" for supporting Village Verges and circulating members with times and venues. A special note of thanks to the A team - Jill Neame, John Coleman, Kathy Alexander, Guy Days, Chrissie from Lockholme B&B on South

Alexander, Guy Days, Chrissie from Lockholme B&B on South Road, for turning out in all weathers and getting stuck in, helping to quietly make a difference to our local verges - stretching from Hartley to the Tommy Road and from Kirkby to Waitby. In addition the social element and exploring quiet lanes has been a great motivator.

The highlight was 18 bags (in x2 hours) around the Midland Hill, Sedbergh junction - never again on a main road - and to inspire "Out of Eden" to arrange their own litter pick in April. The most unusual collection was x 30 mini-wine bottles, at a foot path junction, off the Soulby Road! Which were discreetly recycled.

In addition, we recently reviewed our fares in order to bring greater consistency across all our routes. As a result, some cash fares will be slightly lower while others will increase. These fare changes will come into effect when the new timetables are introduced on 21st May. Concessionary travel will not be affected.





Recipe



Ingredients 4 nice tomatoes per person Small bunch basil 1 cooked sweetcorn cob 1 peeled shallot 100 ml olive oil 25ml balsamic vinegar 10ml maple syrup Salt and pepper

Heritage tomato salad with sweetcorn salsa

1. Buy some good quality tomatoes or some lovely homegrown ones. You will need about 4 nice tomatoes per person

2. Cut the sweetcorn nibs of the corncob, place in a small mixing bowl

3. Peel and finely chop the shallot, add to the sweetcorn nibs

4. Finely chop half the basil, add to the sweetcorn. Reserve remaining basil for garnishing the salad

5. Add the olive oil, balsamic vinegar and maple syrup to the sweetcorn. Mix well and season with salt and pepper.

6. Slice and cut the tomatoes into various sizes, don't worry about being to exact in size and shape. Arrange on a plate, season with a little salt and pepper, then garnish with the remaining

basil leaves.
